Medicare: Who Is Con Artist

Is the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare engaged in a con man approach in the promotion of the national administration's medicare program?

A former Social Security Administration official with a long background as a medical statistician and research consultant, Dr. Bar-key S. Sanders, writing in the current issue of tion's Business, claims in ef-fect that the Department is doing just that in its statistical presentations of the projected cost of the medi

If enacted into law, Dr. Sanders declares, the federally administered plan paid by Social Security taxes would cost at least three times what the Depart-ment's experts say it would and eventually perhaps 10 times as much.

Officials of the Depart Officials of the Depart-ment of Health, Education and Welfare have testified to Congress that Social Se-curity taxes would not have to be raised more than about one-half of one per cent of the taxable payroll for both employee and employer. According to Dr. Sanders

On the basis of all avail-able evidence, even in the first year, its cost would be at least three times the esti-mated cost." And "expend-itures for it 15 years later would surely be more than seven times the latest gov-ernment actuarial estimate. seven times the latest gov-ernment actuarial estimate, and it is probably that it would be 10 times more in terms of 1964 dollars."

Many factors contribute to the startling discrepancy between "official" cost esti mates and those of impar tial experts, chief of which is that costs of hospital care used by te Department are still based on a survey con cluded in 1952 and never updated.

Dr. Sanders charges that "the Social Security Admin istration has been conceal-ing the truth by means of its actuarial estimates." On
