Redondo Leader In Sales

Redondo Beach is one of the county's leading cities in retail sales per capita, according to P. resident Lynne A. Frantz of the Redondo Beach Chamber of Commerce.

Statistics released by the publication "Tax Talk," a Los Angeles Bureau of Municipal Research Edition, indicated that only Pasadena and Lake- wood precede Redondo Beach in general merchandise sales.

With a county average of 100, Redondo's average was 240. Among larger cities, Los Angeles was 108, Long Beach 106, Santa Monica 161 and Torrance 223.

THE OTHER figures re- leased were for apparel stores and once again Redondo Beach was in third position, surpassed by Hunting- ton Park and Pasadena. The Redondo index was rated as 191 compared to the county- wide average of 100, Los An- geles City 165, Long Beach 84, Santa Monica 175, and Torrance 115.

Frantz said he was happy to release firm figures to coun- teract statements made by of- ficials of some neighboring cities which infer that sales in the Southwest in general and Redondo Beach in particu- lar are "soft." Frantz said these figures clearly indicate not only are Redondo Beach residents shopping "at home" —but half again as many res- idents from other communi- ties are doing likewise.

ORDINANCE NO. 1557

COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, ADDING SECTION 29.13 TO ARTICLE I, CHAPTER 29 OF "THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1964," TO PROHIBIT OBSTRUCTION OF VIEW FROM DRIVEWAY TO STREET.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.
That Section 29.13 entitled "Ob- structing view from driveway to street prohibited" is hereby added to Article I, Chapter 29, as follows:

Sec. 29.13. Obstructing view from driveway to street prohibited.

No person owning or in pos- session of real property shall install or maintain, or permit the installation or maintenance or existence of any tree, shrub or plant which interferes with a driver's view of pedestrians or vehicles on the sidewalk or street while the driver is exit- ing from a driveway onto a street.

SECTION 2.
Any provisions of the Torrance City Code, or appendices thereto inconsistent herewith, to the extent of such inconsistency and no fur- ther, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3.
Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars, (\$500) or six (6) months in the County Jail of Los Angeles County, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the dis- cretion of the Court.

SECTION 4.
This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Press-Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and cir- culated in the City of Torrance.
