Program Will Assist Nurses 'To Earn Cap'

Something IS being done at El Camino and Harbor Colleges about the need for registered nurses in the hospitals of the Southland and throughout the nation.

The area colleges have "teamed up" in a three-way registered nurses training program which finds college campus classroom studies combined with actual bedside and operating room experiences in several nearby hospitals.

Harbor General Hospital is one of the facilities helping the future Florence Nightingales to "earn their caps" in courses which encompass two academic years and two sumer semesters before they may qualify to do nursing care and sit for their California State Board licenses.

Harbor College will graduate its first class of registered nurses in the summer of 1965. The overall tri-program is under direction of Miss Roberta Lindberg, RN, Miss Margo Brant, RN; and Mrs. Bernardine Clark, RN, directors in nursing at Harbor College, El Camino College and Harbor General Hospital respectively.

El Camino graduated its first class of registered nurses last semester and of these, nine are employed at Harbor General Hospital where starting staff pay is \$464 per month, \$489 in six months, with annual increases to \$545 plus advancement in grade opportunities and excellent retirement program.
