Firemen Win Exception To Promotional Policy

A split city council approved an upgraded policy for promotional examinations in the fire department, but agreed not to apply the new policy to employees hired before August, 1964, during last night's meeting.

The council voted 4-3 to permit firemen who were hired before August of last year to take the examination for promotion to engineer after two years of service. The new policy requires firemen to have four years experience before taking the promotional examination.

The exception was approved by the Civil Service Board, but City Manager Edward J. Ferraro and Fire Chief J. J. Benner both opposed it. Benner said the standards had been upgraded at his request and he wanted them to apply at once to all men in the department.

ENGINEER Richard DeArmitt spoke for the Firefighters Association, which requested the exception. DeArmitt said men who were hired with the understanding that they could take the examinations after two years should be permitted to do so. Mayor Albert Isen moved to grant the exception and was supported by Councilmen H. Ted Olson, Ross A. Sciarrotta Sr., and Geroge Vico.

• Instructed City Attorney Stanley Remelmeier—for the second time—to draw a new ordinance prohibiting the sale of cars from unimproved lots, after turning down one ordinance on its second reading.

• Approved a resolution opposing an Assembly bill which would extend the Brown Act. The act prohibits governmental bodies from meeting in secret and the new bill would extend it to cover two and three member committees.

• Adopted a resolution congratulating the Boy Scouts of America on their 55th anniversary and designating 7-13 as Boy Scout Week.

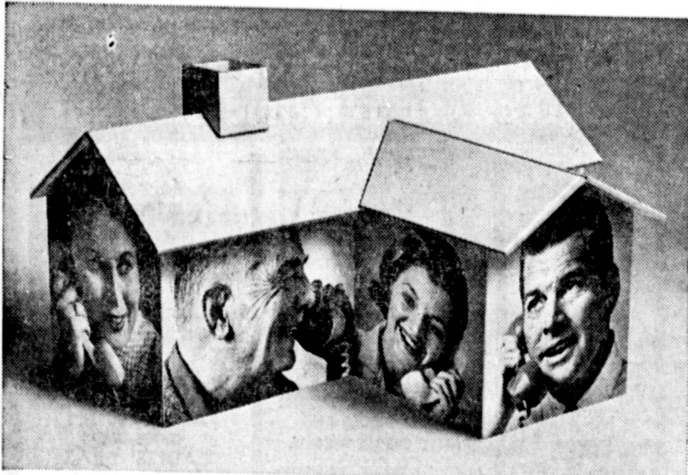

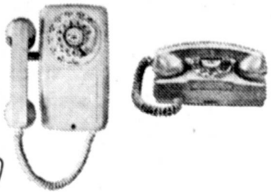
