

# Enrollments Open for Accounting at Harbor

Enrollment is still open in a wide range of classes in accounting at Harbor College, Evening Division, according to an announcement today by Robert Wrenn, chairman of the Business Division. Courses in Bookkeeping and Accounting, Introductory Accounting I, Introductory Accounting II, Cost Accounting,

and Tax Accounting will be offered during the Spring, 1965, semester, beginning the week of Feb. 1, 1965. A beginning level course, Bookkeeping and Accounting, is offered Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 9:30. It is designed to give the student a background in the basic principles of bookkeeping and accounting. It is a part of Merchandising, Real Estate, Office Machines and Secretarial Curricula.

The Introductory Accounting II class, which meets Tuesday evening from 6:30 to 8:30 and Thursday from 6:30 to 9:30, covers the application of accounting methods and techniques to specialized business operations and organizations.

Cost Accounting includes a study of cost accounting procedures and practices. General factory accounting, process costs, job order costs, budgets, expense and overhead distribution, by-products and joint-products, and standard costs are all considered.

This class is held Wednesday evening from 6:30 to 9:30. **TAX ACCOUNTING II** is being taught on Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 9:30. Tax Accounting covers a practical study of the current federal revenue acts including the changes voted by Congress this year as they relate to business and individual income tax procedures. Students in the course study and complete sample tax returns for partnerships, corporations, estates and trusts.

Applications for admission for this semester are being accepted now at the Admissions Office of the College. All persons planning to attend the Spring Semester must apply before Jan. 22. Any high school graduate or person 18 years of age or older may attend. All courses are tuition free to California residents and carry regular college credit.

## Dwoskin to Head Area Probation

Sidney Dwoskin, an 18-year employe of the Los Angeles County Probation Department, has been appointed director of the Harbor area office at 1301 N. Willowbrook Ave., Compton, with a suboffice at 2123 W. Torrance Blvd. These units provide probation services to Compton, San Pedro, Wilmington, Torrance, the Palms Verdes Peninsula communities, and the surrounding Southwest city and county areas.

Promoted from the rank of supervising deputy probation officer, Dwoskin has been on assignment to the probation personnel office, where he specialized in staffing of the department's 12 branch offices and in college recruitment.

At the Harbor office, Dwoskin directs a probation staff of 65 persons whose services include investigation of new adult and juvenile court cases, supervision of adult probationers, and placement and supervision of juvenile court wards.

## Road Work to Be Completed Early Spring

Improvement of Orrick Avenue from 213th Street to approximately 700 feet south of Carson street will be completed by April, according to the Board of Supervisors.

Designed to bring additional traffic safety to students of Carson Elementary School, the work will include fully curbed paved roadways, providing two travel lanes plus parking on Orrick and on 215th Street between Orrick and Ronan Ave. In addition, sidewalks will be constructed on the south side of 213th street west of Orrick. The McAmis Engineering company is under county contract to do the construction.

## Bids in on Harbor City Fieldhouse

Four bids for the construction of a fieldhouse at Harbor City Recreation Center, 24901 Frampton Ave. have been received by the Los Angeles City Recreation and Park Commission and referred to William Frederickson Jr., general manager, for analysis.

Bids submitted were: Robert L. Reeves Construction, \$81,100; Don B. Wolf of Torrance, \$83,890; B-C Construction, \$92,984; and Delta Builders, \$100,934.

The facility will have three buildings and a covered play area, all under a series of connecting roofs.
