

**IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY IMPROVEMENT NO. 2270 OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF KENWOOD AVENUE AND OTHER RIGHTS OF WAY**

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors hereby invites sealed proposals or bids for the construction of curb, gutter, driveways, utility intersections, pavement and drainage structures in County Improvement No. 2270, Kenwood Avenue, and other rights of way in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Resolution of Intentions adopted by the Board on the 1st day of December, 1964, and the plans and specifications therefor which are filed in the aforementioned office of said Board.

Said proposals, or bids, will be received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at the Public Office, Room 500 Los Angeles County Engineering Building, 108 West 2nd Street, Los Angeles, California 90012, until 9:00 a. m., on Friday, the 5th day of February, 1965, and will be opened, examined and declared by the County Engineer at 9:15 a. m., on the same day in the County Engineer Hearing Room, Room 100 in said Los Angeles County Engineering Building.

The proceedings for the aforesaid improvement are under and in accordance with an Act of the Legislature of the State of California known and designated as Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code (Improvement Act of 1911), and the bonds to be issued to pay the costs and expenses thereof are provided for in said Act. It is intended that the bonds to be issued in accordance with the provisions of said Act, and the proposals submitted on the blank forms prepared and printed for the purpose and specifications for the contemplated work, however, will not be refunded, and the plans and specifications so obtained need not be returned.

Each submitted proposal must be accompanied by cash, a cashier's check, or a bond, payable to the County of Los Angeles, in a sum equivalent to at least ten (10) per cent of the total aggregate amount of the bid, as a guarantee that the bidder, if his proposal is accepted, will enter into and execute the awarded contract, and furnish the required bonds in connection therewith, in accordance with the terms of the aforementioned specifications. In the event that a bonded proposal is not accepted, the bidder and a duly authorized corporate surety acceptable to the Board of Supervisors.

**PREVAILING WAGE SCALE:**

The Board of Supervisors of the Labor Code of the State of California, the Board of Supervisors has ascertained the prevailing rates per diem wages in dollars, based on a working day of eight hours, for each craft or type of workman or mechanic needed to execute the proposed contract or contracts, and it will be required that not less than said rates be paid to all such workmen or mechanics employed or engaged upon the work.

The rates for each of the various classifications of work shall be the hereinafter set forth prevailing rates of hourly wages plus the hourly equivalent of any prevailing payments for health and welfare, and other benefits, which, when multiplied by eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work. If being underfoot in the event that workmen are employed less than eight hours per day, their daily wages shall be determined to be that fraction of the per diem wages herein established that the number of hours of employment bears to eight hours.

The provisions of Section 1775 of the Labor Code of the State of California relating to penalties for paying less than prevailing wages is complied with.

Provided that overtime rates of pay for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays shall apply to such holidays as recognized in the collective bargaining agreement applicable to the particular craft, classification or type of workman employed on the project.

Provided that notwithstanding the general provisions contained herein, Guards and Watchmen shall be paid one and one-half times the prevailing rate for overtime (overtime hours per week), and the standard prevailing rate for time worked on Saturdays, Sundays, and where such time does not constitute overtime.

**APPRENTICES** — May be employed in conformity with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code.

**RIGGERS** — Same wage scale as craft to which rigging is incidental.

**WELDERS** — Same wage scale as craft to which welding is incidental.

**FOREMEN** — All foremen not herein separately classified shall be paid not less than 25 cents per hour more than the hourly equivalent of the daily rate of the highest classification in which he has superintended in the past.

The time within which the aforementioned work must be completed by the Contractor undertaking the same has been fixed at seventy-five (75) calendar days from and after the date of execution of the contract agreement.

The Board of Supervisors reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and to waive technical errors and discrepancies, if it do so seems to be in the best interest of the public.

By virtue of Los Angeles County Ordinance No. 4348, as amended by Ordinance No. 5471, all collection of assessments within the time specified hereon from recordation must be made by the County Engineer and not the Contractor.
