

Residents Ask County For Lights

Residents on two Carson area streets may receive four new street lights as the result of a petition now being circulated in the area. Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced today.

The petition asks the County Board of Supervisors to annex the streets to the Dore's Lighting District for the purpose of installing lights on Conradi Avenue north of 214th Street and the north halves of the 214th Street approach to Conradi.

Before the Board can approve the light installation, the petition must first be signed by property owners representing at least 60 percent of the assessed valuation of all property on the streets proposed for annexation.

(Continued from Page 1) minimum range of \$400 for councilmen and \$600 for the mayor," Isen declared. He also noted that a new state law which becomes effective next month will permit councilmen in general law cities to establish their salaries without recourse to the voters—with the rate being \$300 per month for cities the size of Torrance.

Torrance, however, is a charter city and the new law does not apply. Councilmen and the mayor currently are paid \$100 per month.

Discussion of the possible areas of study in the charter is expected to continue, although no formal action was taken during the session last night. Councilmen did move to place amendments which will obsolete charter provisions before the voters next year.

DURING THE regular meeting, councilmen:

- Approved a plan whereby the city libraries will be used for the registration of voters on a permanent basis, provided the registration does not interfere with library operations.
- Agreed to plant 19 trees along Torrance Boulevard between Atkinson and Ardath streets. The trees were sought by residents to beautify the area.
- Sent back to the Airport Commission for further study a recommendation to name the streets on the airport.
- Adopted criteria for determining when school crossing guards are needed for a specific street and approved physical qualifications for crossing guards.

Recent changes in Marine Corps recruiting policy have created wider opportunities for Torrance men, according to the local Marine Corps recruiting office.

Gunnery Sergeant Chet Pavey of the Torrance recruiting station said this week that several changes are in order for prospective Marines, including the following: unlimited three-year enlistments, more openings in the Marine Corps aviation guarantee program, two-year enlistments, and reduction in length of boot camp to eight weeks.

THE RECENTLY announced increase in total Marine strength was brought about to put more aviation personnel in the field, so there are many more openings in the aviation guarantee program, said the sergeant.

Board Okays Improvement Of PV Roads

Allocation of \$11,315 to assist the City of Palos Verdes Estates in improving major city streets, has been approved by the Board of Supervisors.

Funds will be spent for roadway maintenance and repair, including construction of roadway drainage facilities and new curbs.

The allocation is budgeted out of the county's aid-to-cities funds, which makes possible development of major projects across jurisdictional lines to provide continuity and efficiency to the county highway system," said Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

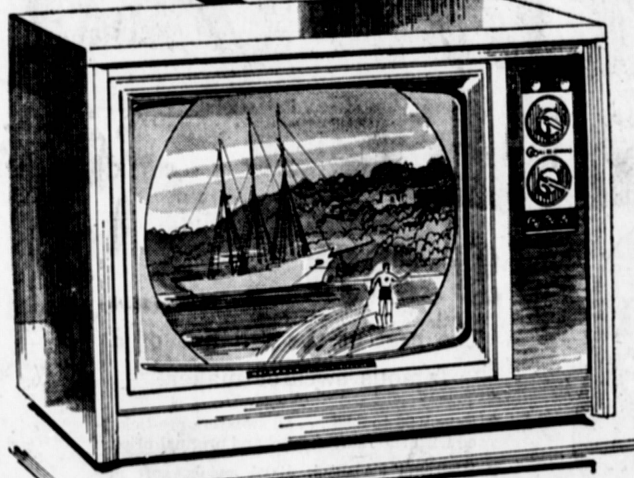

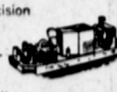
