

Registration Dates Set For Narbonne Students

Pre-registration for students attending Narbonne High School this fall has been scheduled Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, Sept. 7, 8, and 10, according to Mrs. Evelyn G. Price, girls' vice principal.

All A-12 students will register Sept. 7 between 9 and 9:30 a.m. Students in B-12 whose last names begin with A through I will register from 9:30 until 10:15 Sept. 7; with the remainder of the B-12 students registering from 10:15 until 11:15 the same day.

Students in A-11 will register from 11:15 until 12:30 Tuesday, Sept. 7.

REGISTRATION on Wednesday, Sept. 8, will begin at 8 a.m. with B-11 students (A-1) registering until 9:15. The remaining B-11 students will register between 9:15 and 10:30 a.m. All A-10 students should register between 10:30 a.m. and noon.

The Wednesday afternoon session is for students entering Narbonne for the first time. From 1 to 2, B-10 students whose last names begin with A through I will register, with the remaining B-10 students assigned to the 2 to 3 p.m. period.

An additional registration period is scheduled from 1 to 2 p.m. Friday, Sept. 10, for all students who cannot register during their assigned hours.

MRS. PRICE said all students must be dressed appropriately for school in order to register. Department chairmen and counselors will be available in the auditorium to assist in the selection of classes and the planning of school programs.

Students who wish to enroll in sixth period athletics classes, student service, or leadership class must bring their spring semester reports to establish their eligibility for such classes.

Students new to Narbonne's attendance area should report to the administration building before going to the auditorium.

Activity cards, priced at \$4 each, will be on sale during the registration periods.
