Upjohn Co. To Enlarge Texas Plant

Major expansion of The Upjohn Co. facilities in Texas has been announced by T. P. Dougan, general manager of the 79-year-old firm's CPR Division in Torrance.

Dougan said the new facilities will include the addition of a urethane foam insulation operation to produce one million board feet per week. The program is the second such expansion announced in the past month by the firm.

CPR Division of The Upjohn Co. is headquartered at 555 Alaska Ave.

The new plant is part of a five-year \$20 million expansion program designed to increase production of urethane polymers from 20 million to 70 million pounds per year.
