
Aviation Runs Over Torrance SPORTS October 17, 1965 West Scores Fourth Win

"Palos Verdes can have (Bill) Tapp," Coach Fred Pe-terson yelled near the end of

the game, "I'll take Gadbois." Gadbois scored in the sec-ond quarter on a 10-yard pass from Joel Hons and rambled through the Normans for a 28-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter.

West's Fred Schwanbeck also scored twice, once on a 3-yard run in the first quar-ter and once again in the fourth quarter on a 47-yard sideline run. Fred carried the ball 6 times for 66 yards.

Bill DeWaide and Hons each added a touchdown for the Warriors. DeWaide scored on the first West drive of the game, going 11 yards. Hons scored in the final period, taking a 34 yard pass from QB Ron Norman.
