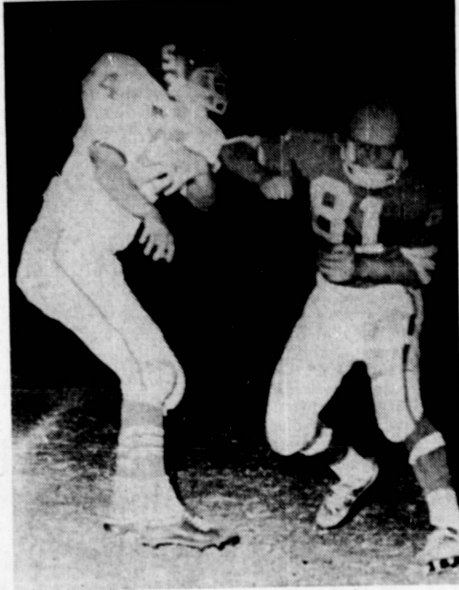

# West Scores Fourth Win

Running for three touchdowns and three conversions, Aviation High School handed the Torrance Tartars their third football defeat of the season Friday, 21-7.

The Tartars have only a 13-13 tie with Lennox to show for its four pre-league efforts.

Cocher John Trantham, alternating three quarterbacks during the first three games, changed his tactics against Aviation and used Bill Bynum almost exclusively.

It meant that Torrance staged a great game on the ground against the visitors.

It wasn't until after Aviation led 14-0 in the third quarter, though, that Bynum moved the Tartars 66 yards for a score.

With Terry Tiedeman and Mark Hornbeck switching at left half, the Tartars tallied in eight plays.

Hornbeck went wide for the 17-yard TD. He also had runs of 9 and 5 yards, sandwiched in with a 17-yarder by Tiedeman and 11 by Bynum on a keeper play.

Doug Kelsey booted the extra point.

With Aviation countering on the ensuing kickoff, it took four first downs and a drive of 58 yards to wrap up the game. The key play was a fourth down pass from Mike Taggart to Steve Barnett for 22 yards to the 3 yard line.

Kelsey missed his timing in a leap to knock down the pass, and it fell into Barnett's grasp. Three plays later Taggart spun over left guard for the score and rolled to his left for the conversion and a 21-7 lead.

With less than seven minutes to go the Tartars came through with three more first downs as Bynum passed to Tiedeman for 20 and Hornbeck had a pair of 10 yard gallops. Tiedeman fumbled, however, and Bob Frickman recovered for the Falcons.

After Aviation's Chuck Rogers was swarmed over trying a fake kick on fourth down, Torrance had another chance to score from the Aviation 21. Tiedeman went 8 and 11 yards, but time ran out as the Tartars ran their final two plays from the 2-yard line without huddling.

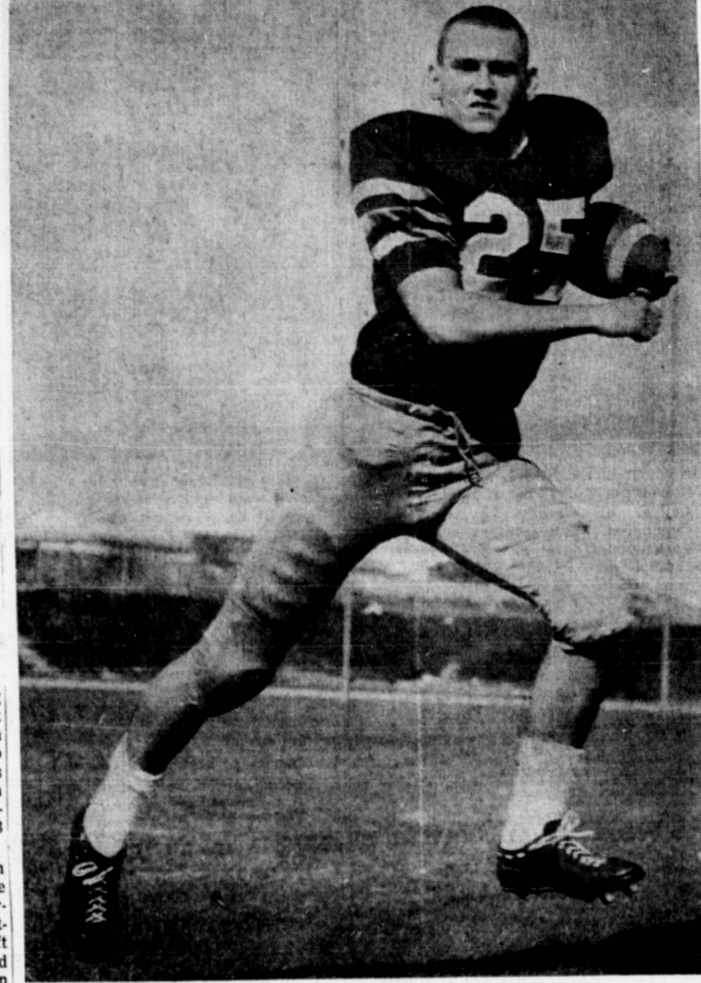
Aviation alternated four running backs against the Torrance defense, grinding out timely first downs throughout the game. The team went 71 yards for its first score with Marc D'Ambrasi rambling the final 11 yards midway through the second quarter. Barnett, Greg Runnals and Dave Stetler were others in the act.

The third quarter TD culminated a 72 yard advance with Barnett scoring from the 3-yard line.

Pleased with his Aviation team, Coach Ed Hyde said he has never worked harder coaching one of his teams than this year. Some of the outstanding players Friday night were not in his plans when the team reported for practice Sept. 1, he said gleefully.

Senior Paul Gadois carried the football 14 times Friday evening, gaining 100 yards and scoring two touchdowns while leading West to a 40-13 rout of Beverly Hills.

The game, played before 3,000 fans in a windswept West stadium, gave the Warriors a 4-0 record.

"Palos Verdes can have (Bill) Tapp," Coach Fred Peterson yelled near the end of the game, "I'll take Gadois."

Gadois scored in the second quarter on a 10-yard pass from Joel Hons and rambled through the Normans for a 23-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter.

West's Fred Schwanbeck also scored twice, once on a 3-yard run in the first quarter and once again in the fourth quarter on a 47-yard sideline run. Fred carried the ball 6 times for 66 yards.

Bill DeWaide and Hons each added a touchdown for the Warriors. DeWaide scored on the first West drive of the game, going 11 yards. Hons scored in the final period, taking a 34 yard pass from QB Ron Norman.

Norman completed 2 passes in 5 tries, but gained 50 yards. Gadois and Hons each added a completion, and Ron Sells completed 1 of 3 to give the Warriors 91 yards in the air.

Beverly Hills got on the scoreboard twice in a wild fourth quarter on 61- and 30-yard passes from QB Jim Huemann to Ralph Punaro. The Normans took to the air in the second half to account for most of 223 yards which they gained.

West's Dave LaRoche converted four times for the Warriors and Steve Horowitz converted once for Beverly Hills.

Scott Steele won praise for his "fantastic" work on the West line.

It was the first victory for West over Beverly Hills in the four-year series and the varsity win made it a clean sweep. The Warrior Bees beat Beverly Hills, 46-7, in a Friday afternoon game and the West Cees scored a 47-6 win Thursday.

Pioneer League play begins next Friday when West hosts Palos Verdes.

North had another first down on the Mira Costa 12 with a minute to play in the half, but with time running out Ball was stopped at the 6 yard line on a fourth down keeper play.

With Verry and the Mira Costa front wall stunting, Ball failed to complete a forward pass in 10 attempts.

The final stats gave Mira Costa a 9-8 edge in first downs and a 163-161 margin rushing.

Barry Winkler of Costa had 3-for-8 in passing for 42 yards.

North High has a bye next Friday and will relax for a few days before getting ready for tough Hawthorne two weeks hence.

# Seahawks Blank South Varsity

Combining a balanced running and passing game, Redondo High's Seahawks handed South its second straight whitewash in the Bay League football race Friday night, 27-0. The game was at Redondo.

Coach Don Hay's Hawks have won their first four games of the season and lead the Bay League with a 2-0 record. Santa Monica and Mira Costa are next in line with 1-0 standings, each having had a bye.

Inglewood was knocked from the unbeaten ranks by Hawthorne, 7-0, and Mira Costa beat North High, 20-6, Friday.

Overcoming early errors, Redondo put 13 points on the scoreboard in the second quarter to gain the verdict.

The Seahawks' quarterback Dana Clyde used his hard running backs for grinding out yardage and his ends for passing in the four-touchdown victory.

The first score was set up with a 10 yard run by Al Pili to the 1-yard line where Clyde rambled over for the first of his two touchdowns in the quarter.

Place kicker Larkin Steinz ran his streak of conversions to seven, then missed for the first time on the second try. He went 2-for-2 in the second half.

A 55-yard pass from Clyde to End Ken Jones put Redondo in scoring position for its third tally. Another pass to Steve Atwater for 20 yards took it in for a 20-0 lead in the third period.

The Spartans never threatened and went so far as to run the ball on desperation fourth down plays deep in their own territory in the fourth period.

It was after taking over the ball inside South's 30 yard line that Redondo's fourth score materialized. Rick Norris eventually went seven yards with 20 seconds remaining.

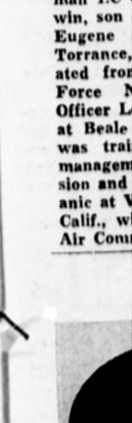
