

District Attorney Steps Up Recruitment Programs

District Attorney Evette J. Younger today predicted that competition in the hiring of promising law students will be increasingly intense for years.

"The truth is that the demand for talented young lawyers has outrun the supply," Younger said. "If proof were

needed, the experience of the District Attorney's Office in Los Angeles County is irrefutable. We have never had to beat drums to attract bright young applicants. We are beating drums now."

What has happened?

"THE ENORMOUS growth

of population in this country is an important factor," Younger said. "The public agencies in the legal field need more help, and business is increasing for private firms. Then, too, there is aggressive recruitment going on here by firms and legal departments from other parts of the country."

growing. That's why I believe the field of law will become increasingly attractive to those talented persons who enter it."

MEANWHILE, with the aid of the Los Angeles County Civil Service Commission, Younger is stepping up his

department's recruitment efforts.

His staff — with help from civil service officials — has prepared a brochure explaining the advantages of working as a deputy in the District Attorney's Office. Early courtroom experience, a chance to go from a starting salary of \$659 a month to \$966 in about 15 months and the prestige of working for the largest prosecution department in the world are cited in the brochure.

The staff currently consists of men and women from 33 different campuses. All those in the Los Angeles area — the University of Southern California, University of California at Los Angeles, Loyola University, Southwestern University, — are well represented.
