Music Show Marks 25th Year on Radio

"Evening Concert," classical music program sponsored by Southern California and Southern Counties Gas Co. over KFAC AM-FM, has just celebrated its 25th anniversary.

Presented over KFAC radio from 8 to 10 p.m. each evening except Sunday, the program features classical selections picked by host Thomas Cassidy from more than 130,000 musical titles, which make up the largest library of its kind in the country. The gas companies and Cassidy have received several community and civic commendations, including resolutions honoring by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and Los Angeles City Council.

The "Evening Concert," with Cassidy as host, now draws some 1.25 million listeners per month, and is responsible for a 13-year-old tradition of broadcasting live the opening concert at famed Hollywood Bowl.

SINCE 1954, the opening has been presented in stereo broadcast over KFAC's AM-FM facilities. And almost 18 years ago, Cassidy brought to the gas company sponsored program the first live broadcast of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra's opening concert, a practice which has also become traditional for the series.

Since 1958, "Evening Concert" has also been transmitted to Riverside area listeners over KPFO radio, and is currently heard over KDB in Santa Barbara.

"Evening Concert" was actually begun by the gas company in October of 1940, with an announcer and arranger named Perry King at the microphone. But a little less than two years after the program's inception, King left for duty with the U. S. Navy, and Cassidy was then assigned as host.

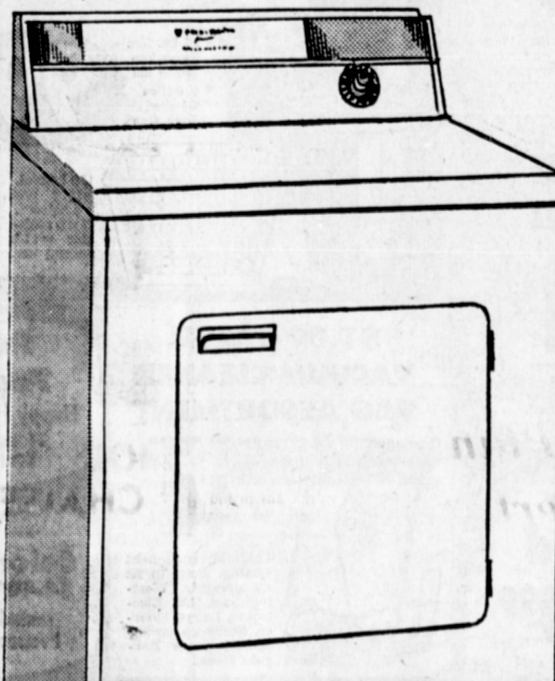

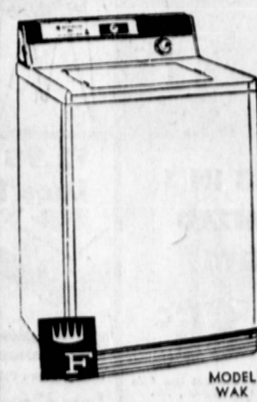
