SINCE 1954, the opening has been presented in stereo broadcast over KFAC's AM-FM facilities. And almost 18 years ago, Cassidy brought to the gas company sponsored program the first live broadcast of the Los Angeles Phil-harmonic Orchestra's opening concert, a practice which has also become traditional for the series.

Since 1958, "Evening Con-cert" has also been trans-mitted for Riverside area listeners over KPRO radio, and is currently heard over KDB in Santa Barbara.

"Evening Concert" was ac-tually begun by the gas com-pany in October of 1940, with an announcer and arranger named Perry King at the mi-crophone. But a little less than two years after the pro-gram's inception, King left for duty with the U. S. Navy, and Cassidy was then assigned as host.






