PFC Thomas M. Kilpatrick, who has been in Viet Nam since early summer, recently put down his thoughts about fighting in southeast Asia and sent them back to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Richard R. Kilpatrick, 1158 W. 220th St.

Kilpatrick is a member of the 3rd Division of U. S. Marines. He attended Narbonne High School in Harbor City before entering Marine Corps service in February, 1964.

PFC Kilpatrick's poem, written in Viet Nam:

HISTORY
I crossed the blue Pacific,
The sun shines down on me;
To Viet Nam I go,
To make history.

People at home laughed at me,
They said I should not go;
But I feel I have a job to do,
I've often told them so.

So I have left to fight the war
That God has planned for me;
And when I return I'll say these words,
"We have made history."

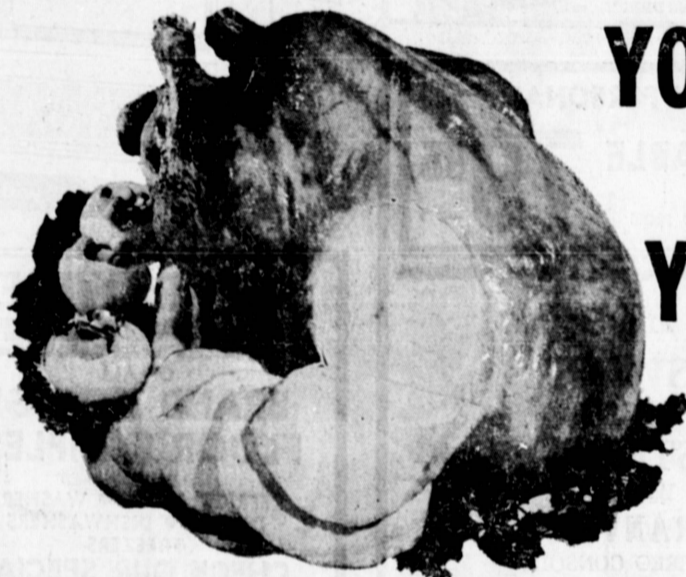
