40 Different Booklets Give Full Heart Facts

What has pertinent facts—life saving tips—graphic illustrations—and is free? "Heart literature, of course," answers Justin Braniff of Torrance, who is the public education chairman of the Los Angeles County Heart Association's Southwestern Branch.

More than 40 different pieces of heart literature are available at the Heart Association office, 16811 Hawthorne Blvd., Lawndale, the Torrance pharmaceutical salesman explained.

"We have heart pamphlets for the rough and ready longshoreman in the Harbor area to senior citizens in Centinela Valley," Braniff said.

"There's literature for everyone," he added. In the last year more than 25,460 pieces of "heartful" and "factful" pieces were sent out to the 21 communities of the heart branch.

CONCERNED mothers can read "If Your Child Has Congenital Heart Defects." Fathers can learn heart facts in "Employment and Heart Disease" . . . and the entire family can learn what the Heart Association is doing from "CV (Cardiovascular) Disorders Are A Family Problem." All of these pieces are available at the heart office . . . or by calling 371-3591, Braniff added.

Other "best sellers" include—"Heart Attacks," "The Circulatory System and Heart Health." And, for heart patients, there is "Have Fun, Get Well." Diagram and chart enthusiasts should read "Your Heart and How It Works." They won't be sorry!

Two very popular pieces include "Smoking and Heart Disease" and "Diet and Heart Disease." The no-nonsense literature answers questions on the crippling effects of smoking on the heart and circulatory system. "Diet and Heart Disease" gives some basic dietary advice in preventing these heart disorders. "Many of our 'customers' are students and teachers throughout the area," Braniff said.

DURING THE past year, teachers from Baldwin Hills to the Palos Verdes Hills have requested the pamphlet entitled "What Teachers Should Know About Children With Heart Disease." Many students have asked for our "Heart Puzzle," "Quiz," and "Drawings" literature, he continued.

One pamphlet often requested is named "Ahora Puede Vd. Proteger A Su Hijo Contra Fiebre Reumatica" (How You Can Protect Your Child Against Rheumatic Fever) . . . especially for Spanish-speaking residents. "Just come down to our Lawndale office or call us and we will send you literature that will fit your heart needs," Braniff concluded.

Cancer in Children Difficult to Detect

Children's cancers are often hard to recognize since, like cancer in adults, they may masquerade as trivial disorders according to Dr. O. R. McBride, M.D., district chairman of Doctor Speakers Bureau, for the local office of the American Cancer Society.

A healthy awareness of the possibility of cancer and a knowledge of the signs and symptoms of childhood cancer may save a child's life. Dr. McBride said an informative pamphlet, "Cancer in Children" as available free of charge.

The warning signs mentioned in the pamphlet include: swelling, lumps or masses in any part of the body; pains or the persistent crying of a baby or child for which no reason can be found; any change in the size or appearance of outward growths such as moles or birthmarks and nausea and vomiting for which there is no apparent cause.

OTHER SYMPTOMS which should be reported to a doctor if they last longer than two weeks are: a marked change in bowel or bladder habits; bloody discharge of any sort; unexplained stumbling in a child who has been walking well and a general "run-down" condition.

These signs should be investigated and their causes determined Dr. McBride said. He added, the pamphlet and other literature is available from the Society at 370-5684.

Lomita Recreation Program To Get Boost From Students

In an effort to provide additional recreation programs for its citizens, Lomita has contracted with Los Angeles State College to hire students for part-time work under the Economic Opportunities Act. Students will be paid \$2 per hour for their work, with the federal government providing 95 per cent of the funds. Mayor Clyde S. Bernhardt said he hopes Lomita students attending the college will check with officials to determine if they qualify for the program.

A student may work 15 hours per week under the program. If the trial program is successful, Bernhardt said, the city may consider contracting with other colleges and universities to expand the program.
