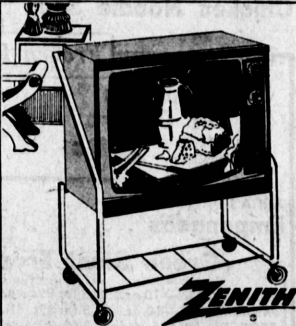

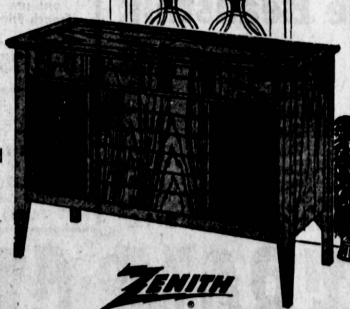

Deputies To Assist At Parade

The traditional assistance of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department to the Pasadena Police Department for the Tournament of Roses and the Rose Bowl Game will be rendered again on New Year's Day, according to Sheriff Peter Pitchess.

Some 400 uniformed deputies will assist with crowd control and traffic on the ground, while members of the Sheriff's Aero Detail man helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft to assist the Pasadena Police Department by spotting traffic congestion and routing motorists around the bottlenecks.

The airborne deputies will join forces with the Federal Aviation Agency to spot aircraft which violate flight regulations and endanger the huge crowds.
