## Law in Action

The days after Christmas are "trading days." Those who got the wrong size, wrong color, or identical toys take them back to the store. As a rule the store will ex change the goods or credit you for the returned item as a matter of courtesy.

a matter of courtesy.

Stores want to keep your
good will. The law does not
require them to take goods
back. The gift buyer or recipient cannot demand a refund or an exchange without . . .

THE CUSTOMER should not abuse his good will. He can't wait too long to exchange the goods nor demand a full refund for the item if, after Christmas, the store has marked down the price.

Unfair? No, the deal works both ways. If you had bought something that was marked down and several days later the price had gone up, the store could not demand that you pay the higher price.

Nor again is there a legal duty for the store to let you cancel the agreement, The store is bound to carry out its promise, it couldn't cancel your order unless you agree.

DEAL WITH rep stores. Enforcement of rights against stores are not concerned wit

IN RECENT years the courts have more often held that warrantles on a product "follow" the product, Though the store and the buyer make the contract, the warranty often protects a third person, say someone who received the item as a gift.

On the other hand, the seller has rights that "follow" his product also. He can follow it with a "seller's lien" to enforce payment. Where an installment pay-
