He is also a member of the Joint Senate and Assembly Committees on Higher Education and Legislative Organization.

Last November, Stevens announced that he will be a candidate for election in 1966 to the State Senate in District 25, one of the new Los Angeles Senate Districts recated by the recently passed reapportionment bill.


The Stevens are residents of Westwood Village in Los Angeles. They have four children.
