Anti-Poverty Election Set Feb. 8 in Schools

A special election will be held throughout Los Angeles County Feb. 8 to name seven permanent representatives to the Board of Directors of the Youth Opportunities Agency—the anti-poverty agency for Greater Los Angeles.

The election will be held from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. with polling places located at most elementary schools in the county.

In Torrance, because of a special school bond election on the same day, polling places will be located at North and South high schools.

The county has been divided into seven districts for the election, with four of the districts located in the city of Los Angeles.

A voter must be 18 years of age if he or she is the head of a family. Single voters must be 21 years of age. In each case, the voter must live in the district and have a Maximum annual family income of \$4,000. Each voter must provide a signed statement concerning family income.

Candidates must be 21 years old and meet all requirements for a voter. In addition, a nominating petition must be signed by 100 eligible voters. The petitions may be obtained from the American Arbitration Association.

EYO board members will serve without pay. Community board members will be reimbursed for transportation and parking, meals, loss of wages, and baby-sitting fees while on official business.

Week-Long War Set on Accidents

Nearly 40,000 employees of Pacific Telephone in Southern California will open a one-week war on accidents next Monday, according to J. P. Leggett, local manager of the utility.

Officially called "Safety Action Week," the campaign is designed to reduce the staggering number of on-and-off-the-job accidents that plague all Americans.

Safety Action Week will run through Friday, Jan. 21, with reminders to telephone company employees and the general public just how serious safety is, Leggett said.

ALL PACIFIC Telephone vehicles in Southern California will sport special safety bumper stickers during the campaign and several buildings in Los Angeles, Pasadena, and San Diego will have windows lit at night in the form of a cross. The crosses will represent the green cross used to symbolize safety by the National Safety Council.

Another feature of the war on accidents will be green cross lapel pins which will be distributed to all telephone employees. Special short on-the-job safety discussions will be held daily during the campaign.

"DURING 1965, nearly 80,000 Americans lost their lives as the result of accidents and millions more were injured," Leggett said.

"These statistics don't tell the story of tragedy, large expenses and lost time from work. The ironic part of the mounting accident toll is that a majority of mishaps could have been prevented by eliminating carelessness," he concluded.

The captain, who received his B.S. degree in chemistry from Aurora College, was commissioned in 1955 through the aviation cadet program.

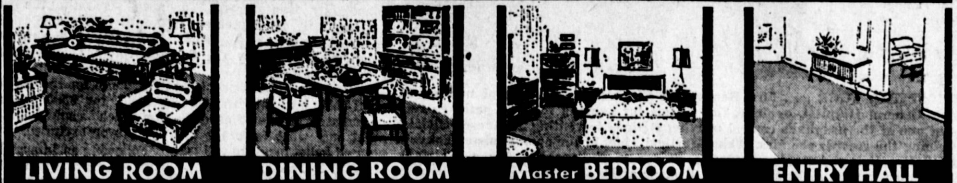
