Speaker Says Principal To Assume Big Role

Drastic changes being imposed on education by state and federal legislation are making the elementary school principal a more important factor in education, D. C. C. Carpenter, county superintendent of schools, believes.

Dr. Carpenter explained the changes being made to members of the Torrance Elementary School Principals Association (TESPA) at a breakfast meeting here.

"It will be elementary principal's job to interpret and implement changes, from whatever source they may come, to the professional staff and community of which he is a part," Dr. Carpenter said. "The principal's creativity and leadership could well mean the difference between smooth transition and chaotic disruption of the educational program."

Principals of Redondo Beach elementary schools attended the meetings as guests of the Torrance principals.
