Garden Checklist

1. You can brighten the January scene with blooming Florists Cyclamen set into the ground in pots. Their exceptionally large flowers in white or shades of pink or rose play the same role in the winter-spring that tuberous begonias do in the summer, putting on a spectacular show when placed near ferns, Japanese Maples, rhododendrons or azaleas. They like a rich, acid soil.

2. Keep on with paregree slouting when the second placeting when the second placetin

2. Keep on with bareroot planting whenever weather permits. Fine roses, shade trees, flowering fruit trees and shrubs are available in economical bareroot form and this is the best way to give them a good start.

3. If your roses are dormant, prune them now. Clean up fallen leaves and debris around them.

4. Look ahead to spring by putting in fairy primroses, violas, pansies and snapdragons.

5. If your ivy needs cutting back, do it now. Don't be afraid to prune heavily. It will burst into strong new growth next month.
