Pep Boys to Award Scholarship In Annual Safety Essay Contest

Plans for the 14th annual Pep Boys Scholarship competition were announced today by Murray Rosenfeld, executive vice president and general manager of the firm.

The competition, which involves an essay on traffic safety, is open to high school students who will graduate in June. The winner will receive a four-year engineering scholarship to a California state college or university of his choice.

New Firm To Locate In Torrance

The scholarship award includes tuition fees, books, and supplies for four years. Entry blanks may be obtained from senior class counselors in all Los Angeles County high schools. Deadline to submit entries is Feb. 23, Rosenfeld said.

Special trophies and \$50 U.S. Savings Bonds also will be awarded to three students writing the best essays on "What I Would Do To Prevent Traffic Accidents and Save Lives."

Judges will determine winners on the basis of the essay, academic standing, good citizenship, and scores on college entrance examinations.

Judging will be done by Joseph Kaplan, general manager of the Los Angeles Chapter of the National Safety Council; Howard Amborn, an inspector for the California Highway Patrol; Cecil Zaun, supervisor of safety and driver education for the Los Angeles City Schools; Evell J. Younger, Los Angeles County District Attorney, and Allan H. McCurdy, deputy District attorney.
