Road Work Due Soon In Carson

Improvement of Vermont Avenue at 220th Street will begin this week, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has announced.

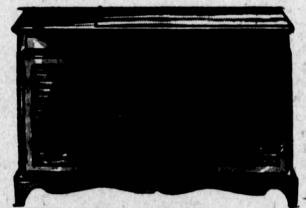
