ORDINANCE NO. 1654
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954*, BY ADDING A SECTION FOR THE REGULATION OF WIDE PARKING IN ALLEYS.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.

That Section 17.5, entitled "Stoping in alleys," is hereby added to Article 17.5 of Chapter 17.5 of the City Code of the City of Torrance, 1954*, to read as follows:

No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle in any alley for a period of time longer than the loading or unloading of persons or materials.

Any provisions of the Torrance City Code, or appendices thereto, in conflict with this section, and no further, are hereby repealed.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined up to a fine not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) or six (6) months in the County Jail.
