A swap session will be the highlight of the evening and Dr. Hans Busch will speak on "How and What to Collect in Stamps."

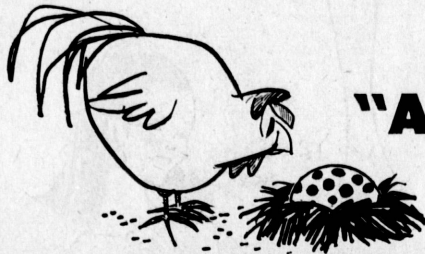
