## Hi-Shear Helps Put Satellites In Orbit

Carried aloft by a single of its propulsion unit with a Atlas D missile from Vandenberg Air Force Base, March 30, two Air Force research satellites are now circling the earth in 480- and 514-mile orbits.

The twin satellite: knoewn as Orbital Vehicle One-Four (OV1-4) and OV1-5, used thrusters, separation nuts, and power cartridges developed and manufactured in Torrance by the Hi-Shear Corp.

For their rocket ride into space, the satellites were enclosed in a protective pod five minutes after launch, which occurred at 125 a.m. Step about eight minutes.
