Area Residents Protest City Sale of Old Alley

Sale of city property used as an alley since 1914 has brought strong protests from residents in the vicinity of Cabrillo and Andrea Avenues adjacent to Plaza Del Amo. A petition signed by 18 families residing in the immediate area was presented to the City Council last week, but action which the residents sought was denied by the city council.

Battaglia disagreed with Ferraro, saying that Plaza del Amo is a divided street and traffic emerging from the alley must turn right. He said traffic problems were increased with the closing of the alley. Fire safety also was impaired with the closing of the alley, Battaglia said.

The sale was completed Dec. 3 of last year, with the city transferring title to the alley to James Webb, the owner of contiguous property. The area is zoned for multiple family dwellings and residents have expressed fears that the property may be used for apartments.

SAN BATTAGLIA, 2415 Cabrillo Ave., appeared before the council to speak for area residents. He told councilmen the alley had been used since 1914 and was extended in 1940 and 1941. The city paved the alley in 1944. City Manager Edward J. Carraro, referring to a map of the area, told councilmen the property had not been designated as an alley and that its use as such created traffic problems because of mid-block traffic on Plaza del Amo.

THE PROPERTY, a 20-foot strip running from Plaza del Amo to Lincoln Street, was owned by the city in fee and was not a dedicated alley, Councilman J. A. Beasley said. There is no way to undo the sale, he added.

A suggestion by Mayor Albert Isen that the property be purchased by the city and dedicated as an alley through the use of assessment district was turned down by the residents. Battaglia said residents would be unwilling to pay an assessment for the alley right-of-way. Councilmen agreed no action could be taken, since the sale was completed in December.
