



**NEW PARISH HALL . . .** A new parish hall and auditorium, seating 900 persons will be added to church facilities now in use at St. Catherine Labouré Church, 3346 Redondo Beach Blvd. The new structure, designed by Armet and Davis, AIA, will contain 12,400 square feet and provide space for parish social and fellowship events.

## New Parish Hall Planned at St. Catherine Labouré Here

Construction of a new parish hall and auditorium at St. Catherine Labouré Church, 3346 Redondo Beach Blvd., will begin in about 10 days, according to the Rev. Raymond Tepe, pastor of the church.

Completion of the 12,400 square foot auditorium will provide complete facilities at the church, the Rev. Tepe said. The church, Rectory, Convent, and a school are presently in service. The Rev. Tepe has guided the development of the church plant since he became pastor of the church.

Designed by Armet and Davis, AIA, the new auditorium will be constructed in concrete tilt-up panels with brick facing at the entrance and on concrete pilasters. The one-story-and-mezzanine building will include a kitchen, a small meeting room, an auditorium with a stage. The structure will seat

about 900 persons at one time. Cost of the building, according to Elden Davis, is about \$165,000.
