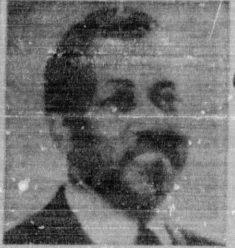

When "Gypsy" opens tomorrow night in the Long Beach Municipal Auditorium, it will be the first presentation in 1965 of the Long Beach Civic Light Opera Association. The story of the famous entertainer, Gypsy Rose Lee, has become almost a classic of the light opera theatre. It will be a delight to again hear those lilting songs, "Everything's Coming Up Roses," "Small World," "All I Need is a Girl" and the rest of the score by Jule Styne with lyrics by Stephen Sondheim.

Heading the cast of the Long Beach production are Bell Ellig as Rose, Jack Elisch as Herbie, Armand Roles as Pop, Kim Weber as Baby Louise with Donna Steele as Baby June; Barbara Weber is the grown-up Louise and Papsie Georgian is June as a young woman. Bill Beadle is Uncle Jocko, Hartley Stevens is Tulsa, Charles Raich is Mr. Goldstone, Eva Rabor is Agnes, Eddie Martini portrays Patsy, Marvin Weiss is Cigar, Valerie Hobbs is Miss Cratchitt and Tom Golden is Kringlein, with three Barbars—Daitch, Baker and Kennedy—as show girls.

CENTURIES OLD . . . Although the voices of the Vienna Choir Boys are always young, the organization itself dates back several centuries.
