Utility Co. Names New Executive

Navy Opens Polaris Work To Graduates

The Polaris Field Seaman Recruit Program is open to qualified high school gradu-ates, according to Chief Mete-ney of the local Navy Re-cruiting Office. The Polaris missile, which is fired from a submerged nuclear subma-

missile, which is fired from a submerged nuclear submarine, is considered a major link in the defensive strength of the United States.

Trainees may enter either the electronics or mechanical phase. Men entering the electronics phase will be thoroughly trained in the maintenance and operation of the intricate electronic guidance system which directs the missil, to its target.

Those enrolled in the mechanical phase will be trained in the technical skills required to aim and fire the Polaris missile.
