

### Urge Compulsory Driver Training Under 19 Years

Driver training, under sporadic attack as not a proper program for schools to offer, may now be in line for a massive increase.

Under a State Board of Education plan, all California driver license applicants under the age of 19 would be required to have taken the course.

William Norris, chairman of the Board's Legislative Committee, said the proposed new program would include the present separate courses in driver education and behind the wheel training. State reimbursement of \$45 per student would be increased to \$55 or \$60.

These funds would continue to come from traffic fines.

Norris said each district should be allowed to give the course at any time and that districts not be forced to offer it. But he predicted community pressure would make the program almost universal. Norris also felt the requirement would bring much greater participation in the program than the present 65 to 70 per cent of graduates who get driver training. Those who had left school would also have to return for the classes if they wanted

their drivers license before they were 19, he said.

Melvin Schroeder of Los Angeles, representing the California Driver Education Association and the California Committee for Driver Education, said the proposal is generally favored by his groups. The committee and driver education organizations will meet before the next State Board session in February to attempt to reach agreement on details.
