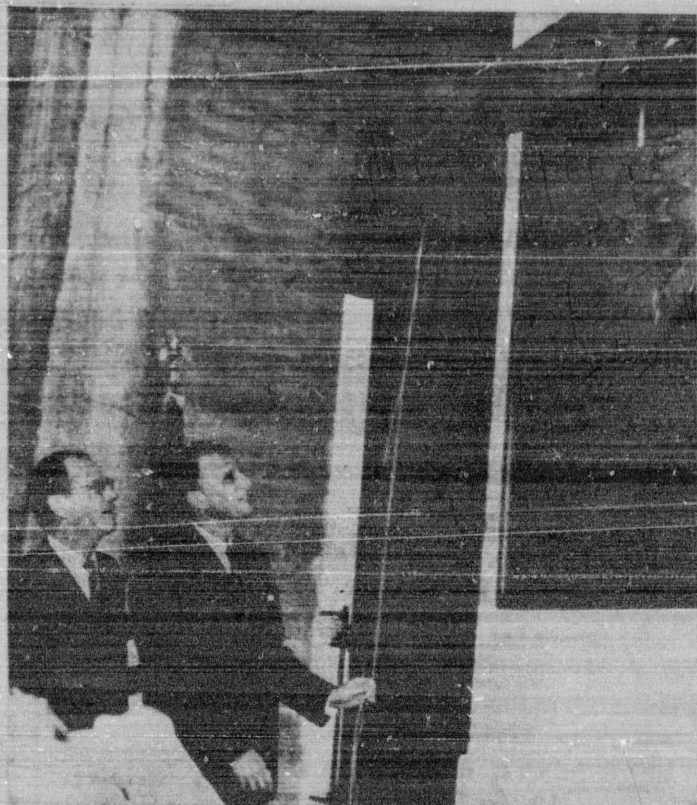


Assembly of God Slates Dedication Service Today

Today is Dedication Day at the WALTERIA Assembly of God Church, 244th and Hawthorne, the pastor, Rev. Edward L. Hughes announced. The Rev. L. E. Halverson, the Southern California District Superintendent of the Assemblies of God, will be speaking in the morning worship service at 11 and also in the afternoon dedication ceremony at 2:30. The Rev. O. W. Fish, the former pastor of the church, will bring the dedicatory message in the afternoon and will speak in the 7 p.m. service also. The new Sunday School wing, enlargement of the auditorium, and fellowship hall which will be dedicated, were built while The Rev. Mr. Fish was pastor. Rev. William Holcomb, pastor of First Assembly of God, Torrance, and the Rev. Charlotte Shook of the Keystone Assembly in Torrance will be honored in the afternoon dedication service as former pastors of the church. The Rev. L. B. Reynolds, Presbyter of the Harbor Section for the denomination, will also be in the dedicatory service. Many hundreds of hours of devoted labor were given by the congregation of the church in the remodeling and redecoration of the foyer, nursery, kitchen, fellowship hall, children's church auditorium, and Women's Missionary Council room. Mr. Hughes said. The pastor invited all former members and friends of the church to join the congregation at the dedication service at 2:30 p.m. today.

Gardena Printing Class Still Reports Openings

There are still some openings in the printing class being offered at Gardena Adult School on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30, states William Johnston, principal. The printshop facilities at Gardena High School are now very adequate to offer this class. The shop is presently equipped with two linotype machines, an automatic horizontal cylinder press, a small vertical press, in addition to other items of equipment. The printing course will cover chop and theory, hand composition, stone work, presswork, stock figuring and cutting, machine composition, basic design and layout, two-color job printing, comprehension work, platen press work, automatic small cylinder and large cylinder press work, trade terminology, safety and related phases of the printing industry. There is emphasis on student designed projects and a unit of basic bindery. This class is designed to meet the needs of students at all levels ranging from basic work to highly advanced techniques. Registration for the course is now possible between the hours of 1 and 9:30 p.m. in the Adult School office, 1301 W. 182nd St.
