

Local Health Chief Says Teeth Need Best of Care

"Teeth were meant to last a lifetime," said K. H. Sutherland, M.D., Health Officer, Los Angeles County Health Department. "Yet nearly 95 per cent of the entire population of the United States has one or more forms of dental disease."

Dr. Sutherland made these statements in conjunction with the observance of the Seventeenth Annual National Dental Health Week, which is Feb. 7 through 13. National Dental Health Week is sponsored by the American Dental Association and its affiliated groups, including the Los Angeles County Dental Society.

Earl Kendrick, M.D., District Health Officer at the Torrance Health Center stated, "The most important function of the teeth is mastication, the first step in the digestion of food." He expressed the hope that Dental Health Week will call to the attention of all people the great need for good oral hygiene, adequate nutrition, and regular professional

checkups, as a means for protecting the teeth.

DR. KENDRICK stressed the fact that if teeth are to last, they should receive good care from the earliest days of childhood. He stated that "parents should be particularly careful with young children whose teeth are forming rapidly to develop dietary habits which include a good balance of all the needed nutrients, but which exclude excessive amounts of sweets."

This does not mean a person can never have a piece of candy or a soft drink; but sweets should be limited and other foods, such as fruits and vegetables substituted.

Because of the rapidly with which acids can begin their destructive action on the teeth, proper brushing should immediately follow each meal or snack.

THE USE OF fluorides is also a decay preventing measure which dentists recommend.

"Fluorides can be taken either in drinking water in the proper amount, applied directly to the teeth at periodic intervals by the dentist, or in the form of fluoride tablets which can be prescribed by a dentist or physician," Dr. Kendrick continued. "Numerous investigations show that children whose liquid intake contains adequate amounts of fluoride (one part per million) throughout childhood have approximately 65 per cent less tooth decay than children who drink water deficient in this chemical."

If your child is not drinking water with adequate amounts of fluoride, ask your doctor, dentist, or local health department about obtaining fluoride tablets."

Dr. Benjamin Spock, nationally known authority in the field of child development, has expressed the following views on fluoridation:

"AS A PEDIATRICIAN interested in preventing ill health, I am enthusiastically

in favor of fluoridation... now we have at our disposal a wonderful preventive measure which does not depend upon the parents' means, or on their conscientiousness, or on the availability of dentists. If a child from conception receives water which contains one part per million of fluoride, we know that the amount of decay of the teeth which he will experience during childhood will be reduced 60 per cent."

The slogan for Dental Health Week 1965, "Healthy Teeth—A Happier Life" can be the slogan for every person if the basic oral health rules are conscientiously observed, concluded Dr. Kendrick.
