

Heart Campaign Ends in Court Injunction

The Los Angeles County February Heart Fund campaign. The Los Angeles County Heart Association has moved to protect its volunteers in the city of Paramount from threatened arrest.

An injunction, granted by Superior Court Judge John P. Collins, would restrain the Paramount city employees from any action which would interfere, harass, or prevent the Heart volunteers from conducting their campaign in Paramount.

This action came as a result of Paramount City Council's refusal on Feb. 2 to grant the Heart Association a permit to solicit during its Heart Fund.

HEART VOLUNTEERS not only give people the opportunity to contribute on a voluntary basis to the organization of their choice, they also distribute life-saving education material to combat the nation's No. 1 killer, heart and circulatory disorders. Acting to protect the rights of the citizens of Paramount both to collect for and to give to the Heart Association, the restraining order was secured from Judge Collins Thursday and served today to City Manager McKeown.

Hearing for the injunction will be held Feb. 19 in the Superior Court.

Investment Firm Votes Dividends

A quarterly dividend rate of 27 cents per share has been authorized by CalProp Investments, Inc., according to Victor Zaccagnin, president of the publicly owned firm.

Zaccagnin said the new rate was paid Feb. 8 to stockholders of record Jan. 13, 1965. The increase, which will raise the yearly dividend to \$1.08, was the third quarterly increase voted in the past year.

Model Car Kits Outsell Model Trains, Bank Says

To the surprise of some toy manufacturers and retailers, model car kits are now outselling model trains and, if the trend continues, model cars could become the biggest seller in the toy line within two years.

This is disclosed in Small Business Reporter, a periodical released today by Bank of America. Noting that model car racing is one of California's fastest growing forms of indoor recreation, the report points out the hobby sport is so new that when industry officials speak of "pioneer days" they mean 1961-62.

ALTHOUGH the hobby sport began in England in 1948, it was slow in being introduced to the American public. However, model car racing is now booming in California, with more than half the total volume of racing business in the United States done in this state.

While many early racing centers were simply another part of a hobby shop, there is no such thing as a "typical" model racing center, according to the report. "Many proprietors believe variety is the key to continuing customer interest," the report states, adding there has not yet been overbuilding or market saturation in the field. There is, however, a current push to upgrade the appearance of the centers.

PROFITS from operating a model car racing center come from two primary sources—selling kits and components, and charging rental fees for use of the course. It is estimated that between 50 and 60 per cent of the industry's customers are under 17.

The report advises potential proprietors that the racing center can cost as little or as much as is desired, but that the probable minimum capital for opening a center is \$10,000.

Model car racing has the potential to become as popular an indoor recreation as bowling, the report concludes, but warns that a lack of industry cooperation could stunt growth.
