Newsman to Discuss Communism

Harrison Salisbury, staff member of the New York Times and winner of the Pulitzer prize, will speak at El Camino College tomorrow evening, at 8:30 p.m., in the Campus Theater.

"Russia vs. China: Global Conflict" will be the subject of Salisbury's talk.

Salisbury's coverage of Russia includes serving as head of the United Press of the Moscow staff in 1944, Moscow correspondent of the New York Times in 1949, and tours of the Communist country in 1959 and 1961.
