

Move on Airport Renewal

General rules for the handling of "arrest cases" in connection with the urban renewal project at the west end of the Torrance Municipal Airport were approved by the City Council last night.

Acting on recommendations from the Citizens Advisory Committee, the council approved rules which will permit the early acquisition of property in the area. Early acquisition will be completed with city funds and those funds will be repaid by the federal government when all applications have been approved.

Hearings will be held on individual petitions by a subcommittee of the Citizens Advisory Committee. Action will be based on the degree of hardship involved as determined by the committee.

IN OTHER matters, the council:

- Adopted on its first reading a new ordinance which establishes new grading requirements for property development in the city. The ordinance when finally adopted, will be "applicable to all property, regardless of zoning," according to City Engineer Walter Nollac.
- Adopted resolutions implementing salary increases voted for city employees last week. The 3 1/2 per cent raises are retroactive to Jan. 3.
- Adopted, on first reading, an ordinance which pro-
