# Freedom Foundation Cites Dean

Dr. Irving R. Melbo, dean of the School of Education at the University of Southern California since 1953, has been named to receive the Freedom Foundation's Special Freedom Leadership Award.

Dr. Melbo is one of three Americans to be so honored this year. The presentation was made Monday during ceremonies at Valley Forge, Pa., in commemoration of the 233rd anniversary of the birth of George Washington.

The USC educator was cited for his "academic brilliance in the training of teachers and school administrators, providing depth and breadth of understanding of our American way of life... for stimulating educational excellence in the spirit of co-operation based on individual responsibility."

Dr. Melbo was instrumental in the organization of the Torrance Unified School District in 1947. In the early years of the district, he served as an advisor to the district's officials.

Dr. Melbo is author of several books, including "Our County's National Parks" and "The World About Us." Dr. Melbo also was cited for his "writings about our great leaders and patriots, emphasizing their character traits, and for his inspiring books about our national parks and historic shrines."

More than 100 of Dean Melbo's school surveys, including surveys in the Torrance schools, have been published.

# Sea Wall Pipeline Completed

Completion of a 1.75 mile segment of water supply pipeline as part of the sea barrier unit now being developed along the coastline has been announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace, chairman of the Board of Supervisors.

The pipeline will feed fresh water into recharge wells dotted along the pipeline route. Purpose of the fresh-water wells is to halt further brine contamination of fresh water tables.

The new pipeline runs from Prospect Avenue and Torrance Boulevard south to Pacific Coast Highway, east to Paseo de Gracia and south to Via Los Altos.

The entire sea barrier project will extend from Playa del Rey to the Palos Verdes Hills when completed, Chace said. Fresh water tables supply about 50 per cent of the water used daily in Los Angeles County.
