Watson Says Tax Shift Wouldn't Add To California Industry

County Assessor Philip E. Watson said today that elimination of property taxation on business inventories will not necessarily mean an increase in industrial growth in California.

Addressing a capacity luncheon audience at the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, Watson said surveys have shown that property taxes are far down the list of factors influencing industrial growth. Such considerations as available labor supply, access to markets, transportation and government services outweigh property taxes in the location of new industries, he stated.

The Assessor pointed out, however, that the overall incidence of state and local taxation in California is the second highest in the nation. New York, which has no property tax on business inventories but which levies a gross receipts tax, is the number one state with a per capita levy of \$327 per person. California's per capita overall tax is \$319 per person.

After 42 Years South Bay RN Takes Off Cap

A party and gifts marked the retirement of Mrs. Estelle Hildingson, assistant head nurse on the South Bay Hospital's medical floor.

Mrs. Hildingson, of 2367 W. 241st St., Lomita, began her nursing career 42 years ago in Sioux City, Iowa, when she graduated from nursing school.

Extension Series on Drama Set

"The Milieu of American Drama," a lecture-discussion class sponsored by the University of California Extension, will meet weekly for 10 weeks starting Tuesday.

Dr. Hubert Morehead, professor of speech at Long Beach State College, will examine the aspects of American life expressed through the works of such dramatists as O'Neil, Anderson, Odets, Wilder, Sherwood, Williams, and Albee.

Dr. Morehead has taught drama courses for the past 17 years. He received his doctorate from Ohio State University and has been on the Long Beach State faculty since 1955.

An afternoon group will meet from 1 to 3 p.m. each Tuesday at the home of Mrs. E. W. Dray, 1120 Via Mirabel, Palos Verdes Estates.

A similar group will meet each Thursday from 8 to 10 p.m. at the home of Darby Silverberg, 2711 Pine Ave., Manhattan Beach.

Enrollment may be completed through the University Extension office at North High School or by mail on forms which may be obtained at the first class meeting.

Reading Lecture Planned

"GHOTT—Fish or Phonics?" a demonstration lecture with third grade students on learning how to read, will be presented at South School, 320 Knob Hill Ave., Redondo Beach, by Erwin Pearlman, director of a Reading Clinic, Tuesday, March 9, at 10 a.m.

Frank Bittick, South School principal, who invited the lecturer, said he and his brother, Ralph Pearlman, are recognized as among the leading Southern California exponents of developing proper reading skills among students to keep the drop-out rate among teen-agers at a low level.

Erwin Pearlman, former teacher in the Los Angeles City Schools, and his brother, a social worker who found the inability to read properly was one of the major factors of teen-age school drop-outs, have been conducting reading clinics for more than a decade in Southwest Los Angeles, North Hollywood and Reseda. Both are directors of Valley Reading Centers of which a Reading Clinic is a subsidiary.
