Lloyd C. Warneke was installed in May 1956.

Addition of a parish hall and adjoining Sunday school wing followed and by 1961 the parish had erected a three-classroom school building to house all eight grades of the parochial school.

Dedication of the new kindergarten room was held last Sunday and future parish plans include construction of a new sanctuary.
