

Miss Five Days? Okay Says Board

Summer school students in Torrance will be permitted five days absence during the 1965 sessions if they make up all work and pass all examinations.

Trustees authorized the five-days absence for this year despite protests from Dr. J. Hull, superintendent of schools, and Dr. Kurt Shery, president of the Board of Education.

To avoid extending summer session into August, trustees have moved the first day of the session up by one week, eliminating the normal week's

vacation between the regular and summer sessions.

TRUSTEE BERT LYNN told board members William J. Hanson and Mrs. Kenneth E. Watts he would vote for the proposal if "the minutes show this not a precedent and it automatically reverts back to three days if there is no further mention of it."

The board's regular policy permits only three days absence when students receive credit for summer work.

Hanson said he could see no reason why five days was

unreasonable.

"We created this problem ourselves," Mrs. Watts said.

"School is school and fun is fun," Dr. Shery said. "I'm for school," he added.

HANSON ALSO said he believed more students would enroll in summer school if they could be absent for five days. The increased enrollment, he said, should offset any decrease in state funds occasioned by the five-day rule.

Board members asked for a report on the effect of the

five-day rule at the end of summer.

The board also approved bus transportation for summer students living in the Del Amo area. Providing transportation, Dr. Hull said, increased attendance last year and helped to prepare them for fall classes.

Sabbaticals Approved For School Employees

Sabbatical leave for nine Torrance school teachers and administrators have been approved for the 1965-66 school year. Three of the nine will be away from their work for six months, while the remaining six were granted a full year's leave.

Six-month leaves were approved for Roderick D. McDaniel, James E. Jackson, and Martha H. Jackson. McDaniel plans to complete work on his doctorate in education at

the University of Southern California.

The Jacksons will travel in Western Europe to observe European educational systems and social and cultural traditions.

A SABBATICAL for Idafaye D. Berner was approved for the entire year. She will complete work at Long Beach State College for a master's degree.

Hubert H. Buettgenbach will attend Oregon State University during his leave.

Studying under a National Science Foundation program, Buettgenbach will complete work toward a master's degree in biological science.

Ruth E. McDougal will use her sabbatical to do research in the field of home economics and study for a master's degree in home economics. She also plans to study for a general secondary teacher's credential.

CURRICULUM consultant Margaret D. Collin will travel

through Japan, Thailand, Pakistan, India, Egypt, Israel, Greece, Spain, Portugal, Australia, and parts of Africa. During the spring, she will do voluntary work in Remedial Reading Clinic at the University of Southern California.

Dr. Richard K. Welte will travel through Western Europe to observe educational, political, and legal characteristics in several countries. Visits to England, Italy, Germany, France, The Netherlands, Luxemburg, Spain, and the Scandinavian countries are planned.

Wilson R. Adams Jr. will complete research at the University of California at Los Angeles for his master's degree. Linguistic approaches to teaching reading has been selected as his research topic.
