Retirement Planning Subject for Meetings

A. Webb Hale, manager of personnel administration for North American Aviation, Inc., will speak at the first of a series of meetings on pre-retirement planning Thursday evening.

Hale's subject will be "Planning for Future Living." Dr. Milo Milts, dean of students at the New Palos

Verdes State College, will be program moderator.

THE MEETINGS, which will be held each Thursday evening through April 8, will begin at 7:30 at the Torrance Recreation Center, 3341 Torrance Blvd. They are designed especially for persons who are retired or who are about to retire, but they are open to the public without charge.

He was a member of the Governor's Committee on Aging and of the first White House Conference on Aging in 1961. Lectures On Family Life Set

"The Family in the Modern World" will be the topic of a lecture series to be presented by Dr. Barney Katz, clinical psychologist, in the Torrance High School auditorium in March.

Lectures are set for 7:30 p.m. Mondays, beginning on March 15.

Co-sponsors are the Adult School of the Torrance Unified School District and the Torrance High School P.T.A.

Dr. Katz, whose previous series here was delivered to a standing-room-only audience, is author of numerous books and articles dealing with mental hygiene, in addition to conducting private practice in clinical and child psychology in Beverly Hills, he is consultant clinical psychologist for Norwalk-La Mirada City Schools and is a lecturer in psychology and parent education for California Adult Education.
