## Veteran Exemption Claims Being Mailed by Assessor

Veteran exemption claims are now being mailed to more than 262,000 veterans who last year received the \$1,000 property exemption, the office of County Assessor Philip E. Watson announced today. Any veteran who does not receive a form in the mail by March 10 and whose service record is on file with the Assessor may request a form, either by phoning Madison 6-6311 or in person at Room 225 of the Hall of Administration, 500 W. Temple St. in downtown Los Angeles, or at any of the Assessor's Regional Offices.

A veteran who is filing for the first time must appear in person at any Assessor's office, bringing with him a copy of his honorable discharge and, if he owns real property, his deed or other proof of ownership.

THE ASSESSOR'S office urged every applicant to read the instructions accompanying the claim carefully before filing the form. Failure to sign the claim means that it is not a legal claim and cannot be accepted. Failure to answer all questions also can result in denial of the claim.
