(Continued from A-1) bid — \$8.50 per call with a \$1.25 rebate to the city—but was overruled by Ferraro who said the city should not want to make money on a necessary service.

Councilmen arrived at the compromise solution after more than an hour of debate on the matter.

Ferraro, who first suggested the negotiations, said the system "has all the advantages of rebuilding without revealing anyone's price."

IN OTHER action, the council:

- Approved the rezoning of a large parcel of land west of Hawthorne Avenue and South of Carson Street. The A-1 parcel was rezoned to C-2 to comply with zoning in the remainder of the area.

- Delayed action on transfer of the Walteria Sump site to the county, pending a report on whether the city may include a restriction providing for a park in the area if the sump is ever abandoned.

- Approved immediate acquisition of property at 23863 Park St., in the airport urban renewal area. The acquisition was approved under the early acquisition policy for the urban renewal project.

- Adopted on final reading an ordinance establishing a uniform building code for the city.

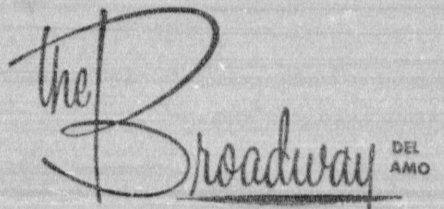
