First Graders Learn Spanish Through Songs

First-grade students are speaking Spanish at Sepulveda School. Not only are the six-year-olds tossing off Spanish words in the course of conversation, but they've been singing South-of-the-border tunes for the past two months. Their exploration of a foreign tongue is the result of the determination of a teacher, Mrs. Nita Paschall, to make classroom music serve a double purpose. After introducing Spanish songs as a means of getting her students to appreciate another culture, Mrs. Paschall discovered the students wanted to know what the songs meant and wanted to say the words as well as sing them. To tie the Spanish "lesson" in with what they were learning during the rest of the day, Mrs. Paschall decided to concentrate on vocabulary

they were using in their other lessons. When the morning's reading dealt with colors, the afternoon Spanish lesson dealt with learning Spanish words for each color and singing songs about colors in Spanish. The day the social studies lesson dealt with dairies students found themselves learning to say milk, butter, and eggs in Spanish that afternoon. To supplement the group singing, students follow instructions from tape recordings made by Mrs. Paschall. How do six-year-olds take to a foreign language? "They are learning rapidly and they are enjoying the process of learning," says Mrs. Paschall. "And I think music is twice as much fun when it serves a practical purpose," she concluded.

Directors of the Torrance Area Youth Bands have begun a membership drive throughout the city. Memberships are open in the senior and junior concert bands, the junior symphony, and in the preparatory band. Teenagers between 13 and 20 are eligible for membership in the Senior Concert Band, while young musicians in grades six through nine are eligible for the junior marching concert band. The junior symphony is open to students in the fifth through twelfth grades.

The preparatory band was organized for students in grades four, five, and six. The Youth Band is the official band of the city and is partially supported through city contributions. Robert L. Jones, director of the North High Saxon Band, is director of the youth band.

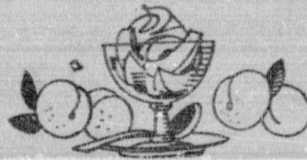
