At Hamilton School

Art Helps Students To Balance Reading

"Oh Captain, My Captain" may be remembered by most students as lines from a poem by Walt Whitman. But to students at Hamilton School, the famous words bring to mind a black and white sketch hanging on a bulletin board in the school office.

Joyce Kilmer's "Trees" and Oliver Wendell Holmes' "Old Ironsides" have similar associations for Hamilton students. As do several other equally well-known bits of prose and poetry.

In the course of their study of great writers, seventh- and eighth-grade students in Mrs. Blanche Stripling's reading class have translated literature into art. After reading classics and the writings of contemporary authors, students have made sketches with ink and charcoal to represent the moods and emotions depicted.

Results are a series of pictures which have been mounted and displayed in the school office. Illustrated classics included: "Leader by Destiny" by Jeannette Eaton, "Moti Gu" by Rudyard Kipling, and "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" by Washington Irving.

Student artists whose interpretations of the classics are on display are: Lonnie Patterson, Richard Hatfield, Christopher Russell, Kelly Becker and Susan Melnick.

Objectives of the literature program are to develop a well-balanced reading program. Included in the readings are: novels, short stories, drama, poetry, autobiographies, biographies, articles, newspapers, and informal essays.

'Search for Disciples' Lecture, Exhibit Topic

"My Search for the Disciples," a lecture and display of paintings, will be presented by Mrs. Sune Richards, photographer, artist, and minister at Harbor City-Lomita Methodist Church March 20 at 1:30 p.m. under the sponsorship of Jean Liles Wesleyan Service Guild.

Mrs. Richards devoted 14 years to searching for men to serve as counterparts of the disciples of Jesus and transferring their likeness to canvases with photo paintings.

Why and how she pursued this search reveals little known facts about each of the disciples. The work involved many hours of Bible study, research into historical literary sources, consultation with Bible and church authorities, and long production work at camera and easel. Each painting was made only after prayer by the artist and model.

THE DISCIPLE paintings and two other groups of paintings, "Women of the Bible" and "Children of the Bible," brought national recognition to Mrs. Richards and she was awarded a masters degree in photography by the Professional Photographers of America. Under the rules of the 92-year-old association only slightly more than 500 persons have been granted this award during the 29 years since its inception.

More than 500,000 copies of the disciple photo-paintings have been printed and circulated throughout the world. The publishers of the Encyclopedia Britannica and the publishers of three different editions of the Bible have made arrangements to include reproductions of Mrs. Richards' artwork and descriptions of the disciples in forthcoming editions. A life-size painting of the disciple Andrew is displayed in the foyer of a Washington, D. C. church.

A group of Milwaukee churchmen, organized as Community Associates, a non-profit organization, sponsored the work of Mrs. Richards.

Reprints of her paintings are included in her books, "Jesus and the Twelve," and "Women of the Bible." "Children of the Bible" will be issued in book form soon.

Exhibit on Atom Visits THS Campus

Science students at Torrance High School recently participated in a lecture-discussion program entitled "This Atomic World."

The program is sponsored by the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies at Oak Ridge, Tenn., a project of the United States Atomic Energy Commission.

The program, presented Feb. 26 and March 3 at Torrance High, is one of several traveling programs which the Institute sponsors. Mike McCormack, the exhibits manager, discussed such principles as fusion, radiation, nuclear reactors, particle accelerators, and radio-isotopes with the students.
