

## Garden Checklist

1. Check now with your nurseryman on crabgrass control. Don't wait. Get into action now before seeds germinate.
2. The 1965 All America winning flowers and vegetables are available at your nursery now, so plant these prizewinners in your garden. There are eight of them, as follows: Flowers: zinnia "Yellow Zenith," petunia, "Appleblossom," snapdragon, "Floral Carpet Rose," and delphinium, "Connecticut Yankee." Vegetables: cabbage, "Savoy King," cantaloupe, "Samson," cucumber, "Triumph," and summer squash, "Chefiat."
3. Feeding camellias is a post-bloom item. Liquid fish, an acid type fertilizer, or one of the balanced commercial fertilizers and iron chelates are all used with success.
4. Don't delay planting your tuberous begonias. They're too beautiful to forget—once you've planted them.
5. Why not try gardenias in a warm, protected spot? The big kind whose blooms florists sell is *Gardenia jasminoides* and is fairly hardy. However, its smaller cousin, *Gardenia jasminoides* var. *radicans*, with smaller but equally fragrant flowers, will take more adversity and come up laughing.
6. By the end of the week you should cut back your geraniums, pelargoniums and fuchsias. Loosen the soil around them and when you see signs of new growth, start feeding.

## Cities, County Sign Fire Department Pact

Forty Los Angeles County cities, which maintain their own fire departments have executed mutual assistance agreements with the county, according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn. There are cities with their own departments, Hahn said.

Three of the remaining cities are studying the agreement, and five have indicated they will sign the pact.

Approval of the agreement helps insure prompt emergency response regardless of jurisdiction in areas where the cities and the county have common boundaries, Hahn said.

HE CALLED the agreements "a tremendous step forward in cutting governmental red tape" which often clutter the boundaries between different governmental jurisdictions.

In effect, the agreements mean the County Fire Department, with its widespread network of 116 stations, will immediately assist any jurisdiction upon request, and the various cities will back up county fire fighters in unincorporated territory.

The County Fire Department, under the command of Chief Keith Klinger, currently serves 28 of the 76 Los Angeles cities directly by contract.

## Temple Sets Adult Series On Education

The adult education series, "Jewish Life in the Twentieth Century," will continue through April 6 at Temple Menorah, 1101 Camino Real, Redondo Beach.

Lectures scheduled are: March 23—"Sephardic Jewry," Rabbi Jacob Ott of the Sephardic Synagogue. March 30—"Russian Jewry," Rabbi Sanford Ragins. April 6—"British Jewry," Dr. Stephen Passamanek, instructor of Rabbinics, Hebrew Union College, Los Angeles. Dr. Passamanek received a Diploma of Law from Oxford University, England.

EACH LECTURE is to be preceded by the following two workshops scheduled from 8 to 9:10 p.m.

"Judaism in Crisis," Rabbi Jerome A. Unger of Temple Menorah. Using Mordecai Kaplan's "Judaism as a Civilization" as a source book, Rabbi Unger will examine the major problems facing Judaism and its survival in the 20th Century.

"A Study of the Bible: the Five Scrolls," Rabbi Leonard Helman of Beth El Temple, San Pedro. Rabbi Helman will discuss Song of Songs, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes and Esther.

AN IMPORTANT part of the county's fire service is its rescue operations. Since 1963, in a program developed by Supervisor Hahn, every county fire engine has been equipped with a portable resuscitator.

The lives of hundreds of victims of heart attack, smoke inhalation, and drowning have been saved by these resuscitators.

## Local Firm To Do Work On Harbor

A \$469,976 contract for rail trackage and site preparation on the Berths 49-50 location of the new iron ore bulk loader has been awarded by the Los Angeles Board of Harbor Commissioners to William A. Smith Contracting Co. of 22122 S. Vermont.

The contract, fourth largest to be let for the estimated \$4,750,000 facility will include the laying of all rail tracks and necessary earth fill on the site, which is situated in the Port of Los Angeles' Outer Harbor.

Also furnished are railroad timber ties for the relocation of present trackage near the site, according to George D. Watson, board president.

Completion for this phase of the bulk loader is Nov. 1, the date when the entire facility will begin operation. However, Watson added some site phase work will be finished this summer in order to conduct tests of certain systems, whose functions are dependent on the rail tracks.

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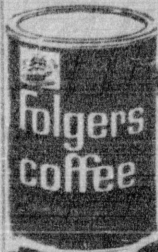
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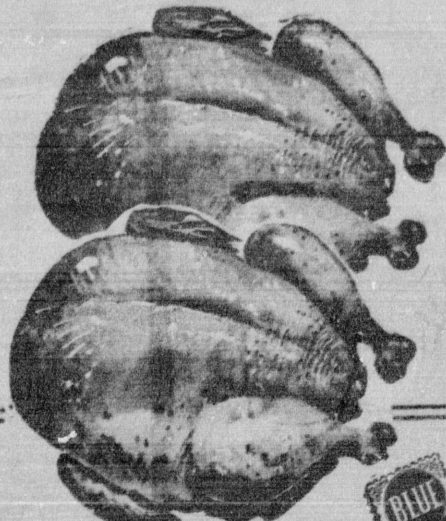
