# Torrance's Heart Open For Heart

Torrance broke a record this year by giving its "heart" for Heart according to Heart Sunday campaign contribution figures just released by the Los Angeles County Heart Association.

In the campaign, climaxed on Heart Sunday, Feb. 28, \$6,053.29 was contributed by Torrance area residents to defeat the nation's number one health menace — heart and circulatory disorders, according to the latest figures. Already, this is \$258.64 more than the Heart Sunday campaign figures released on June 30, 1964.

Heart Sunday leaders predicted that the present trend of in-coming contributions indicate that the 1965 Heart Sunday campaign will break previous Heart Sunday records... higher than the 1963 campaign, the best Heart Sunday year for the southwestern Branch of the Los Angeles County Heart Association.

THE MAIN reason for this, according to Mrs. Belva Brase, 2435 1/2 Burder Ave., Heart Sunday community leader, was the increased local awareness of the importance of the Heart campaign and the tremendous backing received from local residents.

# Younger Makes Plans for Early Crime Investigation

Early participation of the District Attorney's Office in the investigation of all major crimes will benefit both the original investigating agencies and the public as a whole, District Attorney Evelle J. Younger has advised all chiefs of police.

Younger has asked all law enforcement agencies to report to his office at the earliest possible moment all crimes or reported crimes involving heinous offenses, kidnappings, crimes of extreme violence, major conspiracies and similar matters.

Upon receipt of such report, Younger said, a senior deputy district attorney with experience in handling major crimes will be assigned to the case and available to council officers throughout the investigation.

If the reporting agency desires assistance in the investigation itself a specialist from the district attorney's Bureau of Investigation will be assigned.

The prosecution will be supervised by the district attorney of his chief deputy. Younger assured the various law enforcement supervisors that his office desires to assist to the best advantage possible in the solution

of crimes and in the preparation of difficult cases for prosecution.
