There was the performance of Torrance's own Carolyn Peterson in the Corps de Ballet of the new Ballet of Los Angeles last weekend in the Pavilion of the Music Center. Carolyn, as well as the other young dancers,

showed tremendous technical skill and charm in "The Swan Lake" and "The Firebird." The eight dancers, who joined soloists Karel Shimoff and Kent Stowell, of the New York City Ballet, in the Pas de Dix from Glazounov's "Raymonda," were amazingly professional. Allegra Kent was premiere danseuse in "Swan Lake," with Maria Talchiff superb as "The Firebird," both assisted by Conrad Ludlow, all of the New York Ballet. The delight and surprise of the program was exciting Karel Shimoff, a tiny creature with an electric personality and one of the two Ford Foundation Scholarship winners, the other being Diane Bradshaw, both in their teens and from Los Angeles.

The Ballet of Los Angeles school's training program has already started, under the guidance of Irina Kosmowska.
