On behalf of the League of Women Voters of Torrance, I should like to commend the Press-Herald for its excellent coverage of Torrance's April 20 municipal election and of our April 7 candidates' meeting.

All candidates for the Torrance School Board have accepted invitations to speak at this meeting. By providing all candidates equal time to speak from the same platform, we feel that we are best encouraging voters to make an informed choice.

Originally we had planned to present the candidates for Torrance's seat on El Camino College's Board at the same meeting. This is an important position in which there is often public apathy and lack of information on candidates. However, one of the two candidates was unable to accept our invitation due to a prior commitment and with great regret we cancelled this portion of the meeting. This was in keeping with long-standing League policy of not sponsoring a candidates' meeting unless the vast majority of candidates can attend. Presentation of a single candidate for a position would not meet this requirement.

This policy is not of local origin but has evolved through forty years of experience by Leagues of Women Voters throughout the United States as the fairest way to serve the voters.

We are pleased that both candidates for the El Camino post, as well as all Torrance School Board candidates, replied to the League questionnaire. Their replies will be distributed at our candidates' meeting and are available at all Torrance libraries. It is our hope that the electorate will carefully study their statements and if possible meet the candidates before April 20.

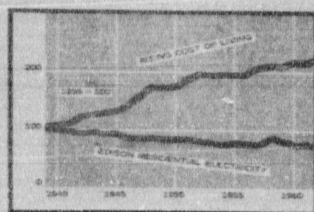
